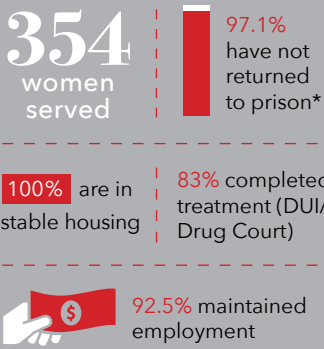

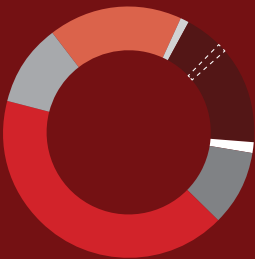

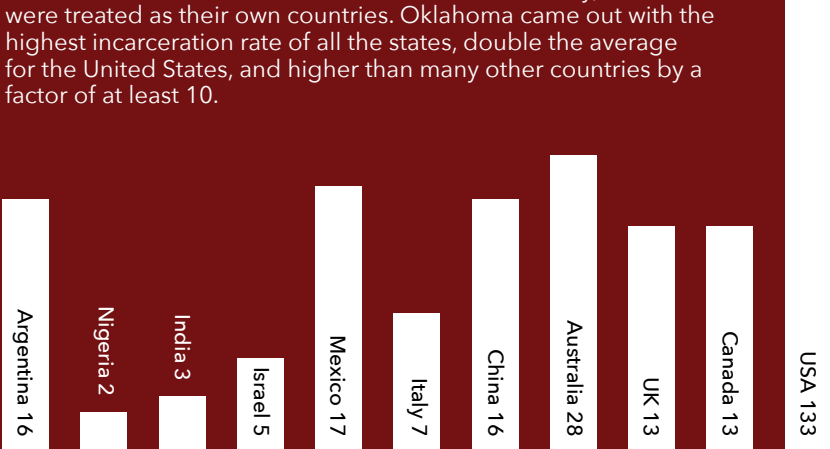

Incarceration is a tall issue.

This graph represents how many women were incarcerated in 2018 per 100,000 people in each respective country. In this study, US states were treated as their own countries. Oklahoma came out with the highest incarceration rate of all the states, double the average for the United States, and higher than many other countries by a factor of at least 10.
